

The Atlanta Bridge Program is a transfer opportunity designed by Georgia Tech and Atlanta Metropolitan State College (AMSC). This cohort-based program provides academically talented students an articulated pathway to a Georgia Tech degree.

How it Works

A total of 40-50 students will be selected to participate in the Atlanta Bridge Program. Within four semesters, students will complete the required transfer coursework at AMSC, and then transfer to Tech to complete their undergraduate degrees.

Program Benefits:

- » Academic advising and student support from both institutions.
- » Networking opportunities.
- » Mentoring events.
- » Cohort-building activities.

Program Eligibility

Students are selected based on academic success in high school and potential for completing a Georgia Tech degree.

To Be Considered Eligible:

- » Complete the required high school curriculum of the University System of Georgia (4 English, 4 Math, 4 Science, 3 Social Science, 2 Foreign Language/CS/ASL).
- » Complete high school with a 3.0 academic core GPA or higher.
- » Submit test scores (ACT or SAT) or be prepared to take the Accuplacer online placement test.
- » Be prepared to take Precalculus or Calculus I in first semester at Atlanta Metro.

Application Timeline

Students must apply to Atlanta Metropolitan State University to be considered for the Bridge Program.

Important Dates:

- » Priority Deadline: **Nov. 21, 2025.**
- » Regular Deadline: **Feb. 6, 2026.**
- » Applications received after Feb. 6 will be reviewed on a rolling basis.
